E. Discussion of Gene McCartney's salary for Acting Mayor - Tim

The City Attorney Justin Eichmann said Gene McCartney is mayor until May 24, 2022, and due to the timing of tonight's meeting and when the request was made, he couldn't get all the information. So, Justin said he will report back to the council ASAP once after he gets more information.

F. Discussion of a Resolution to amend Section 130.03 Road Spills in the City Code – Gene/Justin

The city is having issues with track out and debris on city roads from construction sites and the landfill. The city has an ordinance already in place, but additional information is being reviewed and if approved will be added to code 130.03.

Tim Burress said a citizen named Dennis Boyer commented on Facebook that he saw three separate violations in four hours by Waste Management and shared some photos that he took. The citizens in Tim and Penny's ward are frustrated and they want the codes enforced.

Amber Ibarra went on a ride along with the city police and it was a very eye opening and learned a lot and she encourages others to do the same.

Larry Ardemagni thanked Tim Burress for bringing up issues. Larry also wanted to know when the new purple street signs where to be installed. James said they have been ordered.

12. Comments from Mayor

Road Permits- Anyone who damages our streets/roads to do any repairs like (utilities), the City of Tontitown will inspect and approve all those repairs.

TAFD Contract – The city is scheduled to meet with T.A.F.D. and the mayor asked council to contact him with any thoughts or comments.

We have a meeting with NACA Thursday.

The city is currently working on the air quality in the Waste Management area and a I-Way devise that purifies our air has been installed in City Hall.

Bidding of culverts- Due to supplies issues the city may have to purchase the culverts when they find them, so this will come back to the council for approval.

Track out on roads- Waste Management will soon be installing signs at the entrance and the exit, so these drivers will see immediately the listed fines and as soon as our ordinances are updated the sign will change that it will include the owner of that vehicle. Waste Management did ban one offender from the property for two to three weeks, so thanks to Waste management for helping us to keep our streets clean and being proactive on that.
